FLUTRONIX, CHICAGO SINFONIETTA, MEI-ANN CHEN | *BLACK BEING*

FEBRUARY 2026

Celebrated duo Flutronix (Nathalie Joachim and Allison Loggins-Hull) and the nation's most diverse professional orchestra, the Chicago Sinfonietta (Mei-Ann Chen, Music Director), join forces on *Black Being* — an album featuring the work of the same name composed by Flutronix. Through themes of strength, sacrifice, beauty, fear, and survival, *Black Being* gives voice to the complexities of Black womanhood and provides a musical lens into black female cultural realities and conditions.

HAYMARKET OPERA COMPANY | *ARTASERSE*

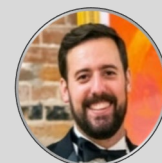
MARCH 2026

The Haymarket Opera Company returns to Cedille with a recording of Leonardo Vinci's final opera, *Artaserse*. Premiered in Rome in 1730, the opera was staged frequently during the 18th century but had not been professionally produced in the United States until Haymarket's June 2025 production. This recording, based on that show, is expected to serve as a reference for future performances of the work as well as a showcase for a stellar cast, innovatively using many different voice types (not just countertenors) for roles originally portrayed by castrati, including the legendary Carestini and Caffarelli (Farinelli's main rivals).

MARTA AZNAVOORIAN, CHICAGO PHILHARMONIC ORCHESTRA, SCOTT SPECK STACY GARROP: "*INVICTUS*" PIANO CONCERTO & *JOIE DE VIVRE*

MAY 2026

Composer Stacy Garrop's new creation, *Invictus*, is a powerful piano concerto written for celebrated Chicago pianist Marta Aznavoorian. The concerto's title, *Invictus* — Latin for "unconquered" — speaks to themes of resilience and triumph. The piece capitalizes on Aznavoorian's virtuosic technique and expressive playing, blending sweeping lyricism with rhythmic vitality. This close collaboration between composer and soloist, combined with the authoritative playing of the Chicago Philharmonic under Artistic Director Scott Speck, resulted in a concert premiere of technical brilliance and emotional depth (captured in a recording session two days later). The recording balances *Invictus* with Garrop's lighthearted solo piece, *Joie de vivre*, also written for Aznavoorian.

**JENNIFER KOH | THE AMERICAN CONCERTO, PART 1**

AUGUST 2026

The American Concerto is a multi-season commissioning project that explores the form of the violin concerto and its potential to activate social change through music. Koh invited a diverse group of American composers to engage with socio-cultural topics, relevant and personally meaningful to them. The project invites composers to view their subjects through the lens of violin and orchestra, asking them to re-examine the conventional musical form of the concerto and establish a new form for the 21st century that engages the fluctuating dynamic between group and individual as a ripe metaphor for contemporary times. Part 1 features new violin concertos by Vijay Iyer (*Trouble*) and Courtney Brian (*Syzgy*) with the Oberlin Contemporary Music Ensemble conducted by Tim Weiss.

**OLIVER TALUKDER, MORIAH TRENK | BRIEFLY GORGEOUS**

SEPTEMBER 2026

Oboist Oliver Talukder makes his solo recording debut — his prize for winning Cedille's second Emerging Artist Competition, sponsored by the Zell Family Foundation. The album features works with which Oliver wowed the audience at the Competition and the 2025 Soirée Cedille gala, including his wild arrangement of Arturo Márquez's beloved *Danzón No. 2*, on which Oliver also plays English horn, flute, and piccolo!

**PACIFICA QUARTET | AMERICAN PORTRAITS**

OCTOBER 2026

The culminating third album in the Pacifica Quartet's *American Collections* series will feature new commissions for narrator and string quartet by composers Jennifer Higdon and Gabriela Lena Frank covering uniquely American topics. The program also offers music that reflects on moments of grief and tragic events in American history. Samuel Barber's String Quartet in B minor reminds us of the cathartic calm brought to a mourning nation by the performance of its famous Adagio at JFK's funeral. George Crumb's revolutionary *Black Angels* "Thirteen Images from the Dark Land" was inspired by the Vietnam War.

NOVEMBER 2026

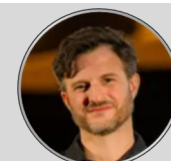
Composer Mischa Zupko and saxophonist Tim McAllister share a long history, working together for over two decades. Featuring a new commission of the same name, *In Sympathy* will document several of Zupko's works for saxophone with him as pianist, ensuring recordings true to his intended sound. The program showcases the breadth of Zupko's compositions for this distinctive instrument as the ~Nois saxophone quartet and Civitas Ensemble join with McAllister on this unique recording.

PATRICE MICHAELS: *ON THE JOYS OF RECORDED MUSIC*

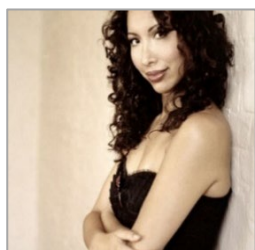

JORY VINIKOUR & FRIENDS | MISCHA ZUPKO: *HARPSICHORD CONCERTO*

JUNE 2026

Mischa Zupko's *Harpsichord Concerto*, premiered in 2003, is a thoroughly modern, highly virtuosic, three-movement work scored for harpsichord and string quartet that draws and transforms influences from J.S. Bach, François Couperin, and traditional Baroque themes.



NICOLE CABELL, TYSON DEATON | *SAINT-GEORGES SONGS*

2027

Following her acclaimed performance on Haymarket Opera Company's world-premiere recording of Joseph Bologne, Chevalier de Saint-Georges' *L'Amant Anonyme*, 2005 BBC Cardiff Singer of the World (and Chicago native) Nicole Cabell returns to Cedille for an album of premiere recordings of songs by Bologne, from a new edition created by conductor-pianist Tyson Deaton, Cabell's collaborator on this landmark recording.



~NOIS | *10th ANNIVERSARY ALBUM*

2027

In celebration of its 10th anniversary, ~Nois will make its Cedille Records debut. The album of world premieres' centerpiece will be a new work by internationally acclaimed composer Nico Muhly. The rest of this celebratory album will feature new and innovative works showcasing a diverse collection of composers connected to Chicago including Shawn Okpebholo, Hans Thomalla, and Bobby Ge.

JORGE OSORIO, DESIRÉE RUHSTRAT | *MUSIC FROM MEXICO FOR VIOLIN AND PIANO*

2027

Music from Mexico for Violin and Piano showcases a collection of lyrical, romantic works that reflect the elegance and charm of the country's salon tradition, a repertoire rarely heard outside of Mexico today. The program holds deep personal meaning for pianist Jorge Federic Osorio, particularly the works of José Sabre Marroquín, a close friend of legendary violinist Henryk Szeryng — and of Osorio's parents. On various occasions, Marroquín would present his compositions to Szeryng at Osorio's boyhood home in Mexico City, to be played for the first time.

EIGHTH BLACKBIRD | *MUSIC OF JONATHAN BAILEY HOLLAND*

2027

Chicago's new music supergroup returns to Cedille with a composer portrait of Jonathan Bailey Holland, Dean of the Bienen School of Music at Northwestern University. Eighth Blackbird has been performing Holland's music for years. In 2023, Holland also joined the ensemble as a guest at their Creative Lab residency to develop and perform new works. Comprising a wide range of Holland's chamber music compositions, the album will feature several recorded premieres.

**BRITTON-RENÉ COLLINS | ALL-MARIMA ALBUM**

2027

Hailed as an “Astounding Virtuoso” and “Exhilarating” performer, Britton-René Collins (recently appointed to the Chicago College of Performing Arts percussion faculty) makes her Cedille debut with a program that challenges expectations about the range of sounds a solo marimba can produce (in the right hands). Composers featured include Minoru Miki, Errollyn Wallen, Elias Hadaad, Britton-René Collins, Samuel Kerr, Joseph Schwanter, Csaba Zoltán Marján, and Bruno Mantovani.

**DESIRÉE RUHSTRAT | SOLILOQUY: SOLO VIOLIN WORKS BY HOLOCAUST COMPOSERS**

2028

Soliloquy: Solo Violin Works by Holocaust Composers is dedicated to reviving powerful solo repertoire by composers whose voices were permanently silenced or severely marginalized during the Holocaust, including Zoltán Székely, Géza Frid, Pál Hermann, Dick Kattenburg, Gideon Klein, Erwin Schulhoff, and Marius Flothuis. These composers worked under conditions of persecution, displacement, and profound uncertainty; their works demonstrate extraordinary artistic resilience and expressive depth.

**VARIOUS | OKPEBHOLO CHAMBER WORKS**

2028

Okpebholo Chamber Works brings together Chicago composer Shawn E. Okpebholo and an all-Chicago roster of acclaimed performers, marking the first recording devoted exclusively to Okpebholo’s chamber music. The album presents works deeply connected to Chicago’s history, communities, and cultural life. Collaborators include Eighth Blackbird, violinist Rachel Barton Pine, Picoso Ensemble, Grossman Ensemble, and saxophonist Julian Velasco, among others. These world-premiere recordings will offer a vivid portrait of Chicago through artists who have shaped — and been shaped by — the city’s vibrant music scene.

**D-COMPOSED | SOUNDS LIKE US**

2028

Sounds Like Us marks the commercial debut recording of D-Composed, Chicago’s only chamber music ensemble dedicated exclusively to Black performers presenting the music of Black composers, boldly reexamining what comprises “classical” music — and who gets to be called a “composer.” This expansive double-length album places works by Jessie Montgomery, Nathalie Joachim, Tomeka Reid, and Florence Price, among others, in conversation with broader Black musical lineages and aesthetics. By centering both historic figures and contemporary innovators, the project reframes Black music as foundational to the classical tradition rather than peripheral to it. Above all, *Sounds Like Us* is an exuberant celebration of Black joy, stylistic breadth, and creative abundance.
